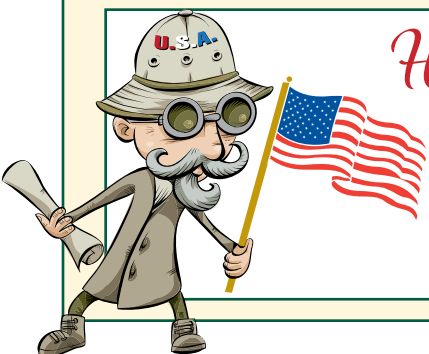
A fun-filled expansion party was held in the tent with almost an overflow crowd in attendance. During
